UNESCO World Heritage:

2019 marked the 25th anniversary of Luxembourg City's inscription on the UNESCO World Heritage list in 1994. "Luxembourg, its old quarters and fortifications" bear witness to the city's turbulent history that dates back to the year 963.

Luxembourg City Underground:

Explore the depth of the city! Luxembourg's casemates are full of mystery. If they could speak, they would tell gloomy stories of long ago when Luxembourg was one of the most envied fortresses in Europe, also called Gibraltar of the North. Nowadays two networks of underground galleries are open to the public: The Pétrusse Casemates with a cutting-edge scenography and mesmerising light installations that bring history to life and the Bock Casemates, with splendid views out of the rocks. The fortifications of the city of Luxembourg and its old quarters were inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage list in 1994.

Grand ducal Palace:

Kirchberg Plateau:

The Kirchberg Plateau is the business district of Luxembourg's banking and financial centre and is home to one of the several seats of the European Union, the European Court of Justice, the European Investment Bank and the European Court of Auditors.

During the summer months, the city centre comes to life thanks to the "**Summer in the City**" festival, with an extensive program of outdoor events, exhibitions, virtual activities, live stream events, and countless other tourist attractions.
