





UNESCO World Heritage:

This year marks the 25th anniversary of Luxembourg City's inscription on the UNESCO World Heritage list in 1994. "Luxembourg, its old quarters and fortifications" bear witness to the city's turbulent history that dates back to the year 963.

Bock Casemates:

With almost 150,000 visitors per year, the Bock Casemates are among Luxembourg's most popular tourist attractions. Inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List since 1994, the origin of this immense underground military defence system dates back to the 17th century. Explore these underground galleries at your own pace or with a guide and descend into the capital's rich history.

Grand ducal Palace:

Formerly used as a city hall, the grand ducal Palace has been the Grand Duke's city residence since 1890. Kirchberg Plateau:

The Kirchberg Plateau is the business district of Luxembourg's banking and financial centre and is home to one of the several seats of the European Union, the European Court of Justice, the European Investment Bank and the European Court of Auditors.

Luxembourg's unique way of life is reflected in its cuisine where local specialities, international flavours and wine varieties from the Luxembourg Moselle are intertwined.






